

Medication


Please be advised if you require office staff to give your child prescribed medication for a short-term period we will need the following:

- \checkmark The letter must also state the required time the child is to take the medication.

Nhat's Happening in Kindergarten

LITERACY

This term, Kindergarten have been looking at imaginative texts while developing their writing skills. We have been reading books and writing about the beginning, middle and end.

KO read 'There's a Sea in my Bedroom' and to really experience the story they went down to the sandpit to put their toes in the sand and listened to the sounds in seashells.

SIGHT WORD RINGS

All kindergarten classes have word rings allowing them to practise their words at home. Each Monday, students are to bring their word rings to receive the new words for the week. Term 3 words are added every Monday, so students can practise and gradually build their knowledge of new words. Sight word rings are important for your child's learning. Word rings are taken home to practise however they are also used in class to support learning.





NUMERACY

In Mathematics this term, Kindergarten have been investigating patterns and fractions. Students have been building a range of patterns, including AB, AAB, ABC and ABB. Students are learning how to recognise and show halves. They are also learning how to show half of a collection.

KG have been working hard on creating different patterns.



In KA we have been learning about Patterns. We made some AB, ABC, ABB and AAB patterns with different materials!



Three Block Towers






How many different towers can you make using one red, one blue and one yellow block?




On a digital clock showing 24-hour time, over a whole day, how many times does a 5 appear?

NCCD LETTER FOR PARENTS



Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
